

Sight Words

Sight words are words that appear frequently in reading and writing. Young children are encouraged to recognize these words by sight, without having to sound them out. Some ways to help your child learn sight words might be:

Start by pointing to one word and say the word. Ask your child to repeat the word. Next, use the word in a sentence to give it meaning. For example, "Lily likes to play jump rope outside." Now, invite your child to think about and say their own sentence using the sight word in context.
